The Sheraton parking deck entrance is around the block from the South Salisbury Street entrance to the Sheraton. Parking is \$15 per day.

- 1. From the South Salisbury Street entrance, drive half a block down South Salisbury Street and turn right onto West Cabarrus Street (there is no left-turn option).
- 2. Take the first right onto Gale Street.
- 3. The entrance to the Sheraton deck is the <u>second one on the right</u>, with a vertical blue sign with PARK in white letters. There are several other public parking decks in the area with similar rates.

"Opportunities in Public Service" Lunch Conversation Prompts

During lunch on Thursday, each Learning Team will be joined by an LNC alumnus who is engaged in public service personally, professionally and/or in an elected capacity. These conversations are intended to provide context and perspective leading into the afternoon's Budgetopolis simulation.

Each guest will start by introducing themselves and sharing a bit about their role and what led them to it. From there, the conversations are up to your Learning Teams. Some suggested conversation topics and prompts are included below to get things started. Feel free to follow these points or take your conversations in a different direction.

- Compromise during partisan times—During this afternoon's Budgetopolis simulation, Class 30
 members will have to make some tough decisions and often find ways to compromise with their
 team members. How do you decide when to compromise, and how can cooperation and
 compromise be encouraged across the board?
- Decision-making—How do you make decisions, and specifically, how do you make decisions on issues that are outside your own knowledge and expertise?
- Constituent engagement—How do you typically hear from and engage with your constituents? What is the most effective way for LNC participants to engage with their local and elected officials? (And, what proves least effective?)
- Money—How do you engage with money and resources, from finding money to deciding where it goes?
- Community engagement—How do you engage your community in decision-making?

- Media—How has the decline of traditional media and the increased use of social media impacted the ability for local government to get information out to the public? How do you engage with social media and traditional media outlets?
- Major Issues—What are the major issues you face in this role right now? Who is involved in helping to solve these issues?
- Other Ideas—
 - What is the most rewarding thing that you've been a part of in this role?
 - O What is the most ridiculous thing?
 - O What surprised you most?


