Hotel Parking

The parking deck entrance is on 3rd Street, just past the hotel entrance.

Hotel Guests—Important Ticket Validation Instructions

- Pull a ticket when you enter the deck.
- Take the ticket to the hotel desk and have it validated when you check in.
- This validated ticket allows in/out privileges and must be used to enter and exit the deck throughout your stay.
- Be sure to have this ticket accessible when you leave on Thursday morning.
- Parking charges will appear on your hotel bill. Overnight self-parking is \$30/night. Valet parking is not available.

Follow blue arrows on the map below to the Express Deck Self Park area. Once parked, pull a ticket from the dispenser. Bring the ticket with you for validation at the front desk. Ignore signs about QR codes required for parking—this does not apply to our group.

Take the stairs or elevator to level 3 to access the pedestrian bridge to the walkway to the CLT Center.

Important Airport Tour Details

- Arrive by 12:45 pm to park and get settled for program to start promptly at 1:00 pm. Late arrivals cannot be accommodated.

Walking from the Courtyard Marriott

Turn left down South Tryon Street from the Courtyard Marriott. Proceed two blocks. The entrance to the Gantt Center will be on your left.

Parking

<u>Levine Center for the Arts Parking Deck</u>: The closest parking deck is the Levine Center for the Arts deck, with entrances at <u>550 South Tryon Street</u> and at <u>130 West Brooklyn Village Avenue</u>. Once parked, head for the Plaza elevators (not the Tower elevators). Level P \star will take you to the street level and the Gantt Center is just across South Tryon Street from the garage. Discounted parking passes for the Levine Deck <u>only</u> will be available from the Gantt Center liaison. When exiting the parking garage, the maximum charge with the Gantt pass is \$10.00 on weekdays and weekends.

Duke Energy Plaza—Wednesday and Thursday Meeting Location

Be prepared to show a government-issued photo ID upon arrival. Walk in the glass doors of the building. On the left side of the lobby, a Duke Energy team member will greet attendees at the Visitor Registration desk and provide the required escort to the meeting space on the 7th floor. If there is not an escort available when you arrive, call or text Kelly (919.523.4336) or Brian (919.609.1113) and they will send someone down for you.

Walking from the Courtyard Marriott


