





### County Educational Attainment Rate Growth from 2018 to 2021 the share of population holding a postsecondary degree/credential




#### **Leaky Education Pipeline**









#### On-Time Postsecondary Enrollment and Persistence

Why? Students who enroll in postsecondary immediately after high school graduation are more likely to stay in school and complete a degree.

#### **Adult Learner Enrollment and Persistence**

Why? For North Carolina to meet our 2 million by 2030 goal, we must engage and support more adults to start and/or return and finish postsecondary credentials that have industry value and are meaningful to the individuals.

#### **Labor Market Alignment**

Why? In most regions of North Carolina, postsecondary degrees and credentials awarded are not sufficiently aligned with job opportunities in the area, limiting a graduate's ability to earn a family-sustaining wage. While the state, overall, has a high rate of labor market alignment, most regions (14 out of 16) fall short of the state average.

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

How students in Alamance County traditional schools are currently doing:


To meet state goals, each year Alamance County needs:

- 46% of eligible 4-year-olds enrolled in NC Pre-K program; 302 more needed to meet state goal of 75%, 2022
- 22% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in reading; 5,281 more needed to meet state goal of 73%. 2022
- 25% of 3-8 graders are earning college-and-career-ready scores (level 4 or 5) in math; 6,342 more needed to meet state goal of 86%. 2022
- 87% of 9th graders graduate within four years; 141 more needed to meet state goal of 95%. 2021
- 34% of students are chronically absent from school; 4,914 less needed to meet state goal of 11%, 2021
- Alamance County has a student-to-school counselor ratio of 365:1 versus 336:1 in peer counties. 2021

28,675 total students were enrolled in K-12 in Alamance County in the 2021-22 school year.

Career and College Preparation 951 high school students

951 high school students took at least one AP course (15%) versus 15% in peer counties (2021).


618 graduates participated in Career & College Promise programs (38%) versus 33% in peer counties (2021).

Students in Alamance County completed 1,063 Career & Technical Education concentrations in 2021. The top three CTE concentrations completed include Arts, Audio/Video Technology, & Communications; Human Services; and Health Science.

#### 56% of seniors completed the FAFSA in 2022; 357 more need to complete in 2022 to meet state goal of 80%, 2022 https://www.mvfuturenc.org/ourwork/first-in-fafsa/

- 63% of graduates reported intentions to enroll in a postsecondary institution versus 75% in peer counties. 2021
- 48% of graduates enrolled in a postsecondary institution within 12 months versus 55% in peer counties, 2021

61% of Alamance County students have parents with no college degree (either 2- or 4-year) versus 49% in peer counties.
