



- *\$93 million in Pell Grants* awarded in 2021-2022.

Supporting State, Federal, Scholarship Funding

NCICU's 36 Institutions

- Average Tuition & Fees: \$34,111
- Nearly 50% of NC students receive federal Pell Grants
- \$92 million in state financial aid
- \$1.2 billion in institutional aid


