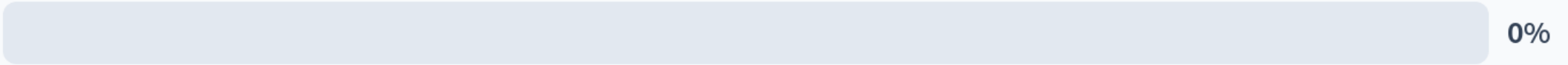


What % of NC's population is employed in ag-related jobs or farming?

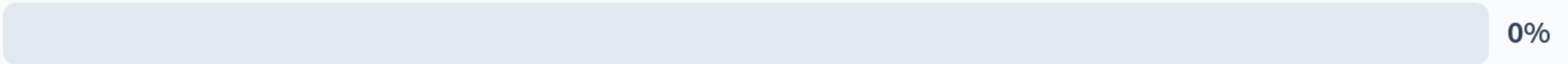

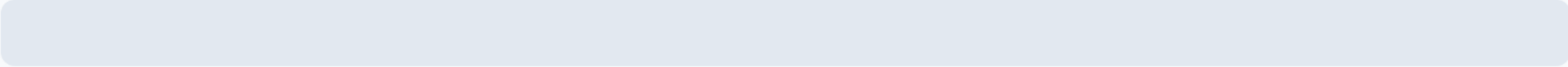
How much NC revenue is generated annually through farming?

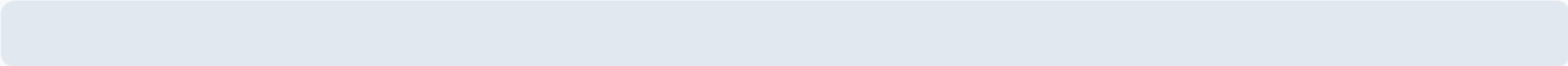

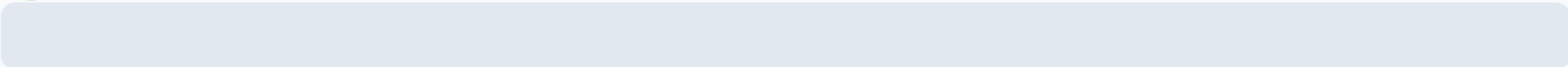

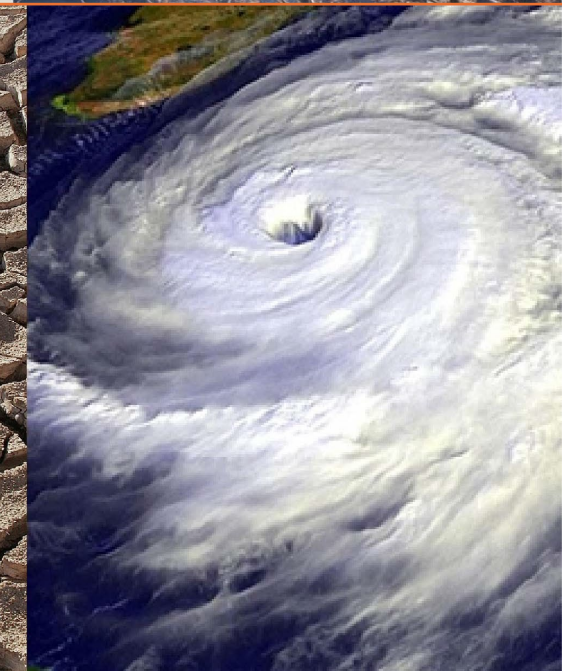
The environment is fragile, and we been on the gradual
