



- Students will hear from each of the participating colleges and universities they have selected with information about individual campus requirements, their conditional acceptance, and the availability of financial aid.



TRANSFER PATHWAYS

NCICU Receives \$1.3M Grant to Partner with NCCCS to Streamline Transfer Pathways

NCICU and the <u>North Carolina Community College System</u> (<u>NCCCS</u>) announced a new grant-funded partnership to facilitate the successful transfer of course credits for students moving from two-year colleges to four-year private colleges and universities in the state.

The new initiative will leverage technology from <u>Acadeum</u> to streamline the transfer process and reduce credit loss, to replicate this technology in other states through the generous support of a \$1.3 million collective grant.
