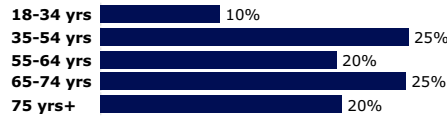

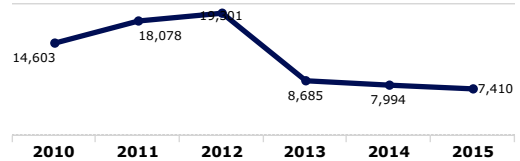

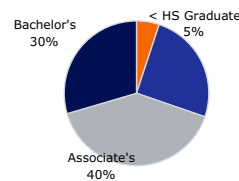

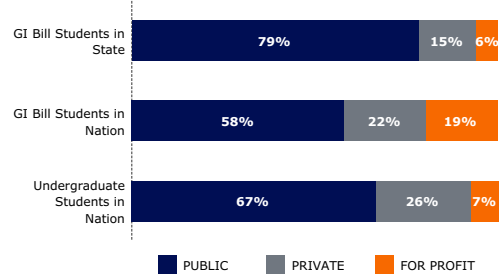

### LEVEL OF VETERAN EDUCATION BREAKDOWN



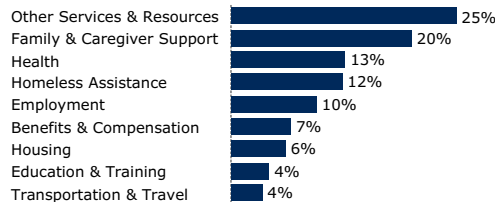
### ENROLLMENT BREAKDOWN BY SCHOOL TYPE



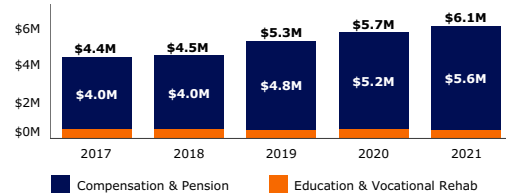
