The more you know about the issue and the process, the better you will be able to participate during the exercise.

"Budgetopolis" Homework for Thursday

Watch the short video, become familiar with the simulation instructions, and think about whether you'd like to serve as Mayor or Clerk for your Learning Team. It will be helpful for the Clerk to have two monitors or the ability to split their screen on one large monitor.

Thursday Program Materials

Budgetopolis: Homework and Instructions

On Thursday afternoon you will be divided into your Learning Teams to participate in the Budgetopolis simulation. To make the most of the simulation, be sure you have reviewed these <u>Budgetopolis</u> <u>Materials</u> (password is "training") and the notes below in advance—watch the short video, become familiar with the simulation instructions, have access to the <u>Options Card</u> (printed or online) during session, and think about whether you'd like to serve as Mayor or Clerk for your Learning Team.

Much of the game will be played in Zoom breakout rooms. A planning committee member from Class XXVIII will join each Class XXIX Learning Team to help answer procedural or technical questions throughout the simulation and to manage the team's game board.

At the start of the simulation, each team will choose a Mayor and a Clerk.

- The Mayor will serve as the group's spokesperson and will help guide the conversation.
- The Clerk will need access to a web browser to manage the Clerk's Recording Tool (see below). It is helpful, but not required, for the Clerk to have a second monitor or the ability to split a large screen between Zoom and a browser.
- Both the Mayor and the Clerk should have access to pen and paper to take notes on the team's decisions
- All participants are encouraged to have the Budgetopolis materials page open in a browser or on a separate device during the game. Print or have online access to the Options Card.
- Each team's planning committee resource person will manage the game board and screen sharing.

Clerk's Recording Tool Links

The Clerk for each Learning Team will use their team's unique link (below) to access a web-based tool to record the team's decisions during the simulation. The Clerk will need to keep this tool open throughout the simulation—do NOT close it or refresh it until the end of the game.


