

Projected growth in NC occupations by required education, 2014-24



Educational attainment of NC adults (25-64), 2016





Varying attainment for demographic groups


NC educational attainment by race/ethnicity (25-64), 2016



Highest attainment of parents or householder for NC children in households, 2016





NC Pipeline 2017: Loss Points

15,600 9th graders (2013-14) dropped out or delayed

17,100 graduates intend on work or military
