One Modern System

The NC Community College System is made up of 58 colleges serving each of North Carolina's 100 counties.





One Modern System

- Almost 700,000 students annually
- 275+ programs offered
- 67,000+ degrees and certificates awarded annually
- Third largest community college system in the U.S.



System Structure

- The State Board of Community Colleges is the System's governing board and hires the System president.
- The System President is supported by the staff of the System Office (around 200 employees).
- The NC Community Colleges Foundation supports the mission of the system.
- Each of the 58 community colleges has a local board of trustees and a college president, as well as a college foundation.



Financial Support of Colleges

- By statute, the State is responsible for support of instruction, administration, and support services.
 - For FY 2020-21, total state budget is \$1.66B, with \$1.23B from appropriations and \$430M from receipts (primarily tuition and fees.
- Operation and maintenance of plant is a local (county) responsibility.
